STEPS FOR OBTAINING NYS LICENSURE AS AN AUDIOLOGIST

Licensure Requirements



- **Be of good moral character**
- **Be at least 21 years of age**
- **Meet the education requirements**
- **Meet the test requirements (ETS Praxis II)**
- **Meet the experience requirements**
- **Pay the application fee (\$294.00)**

First Things First



You're going to need your ETS (Praxis II) test results.

Getting these takes time so start this process first!

As soon as you graduate:

Complete Form 1: Application for Licensure

Mail this form and the appropriate fee (\$294.00) to:
New York State Education Department, Office of the
Professions, PO Box 22063, Albany, NY 12201.

-DO NOT SEND CASH-

Make check or money order payable to the New York
State Education Department.

**Once your degree has been conferred:
Complete Form 2: Certification of Professional
Education**

Do NOT mail this to the NYS Office of the Professions!

Complete and mail Form 2 to your degree-granting institution – and check with them to determine if there is a fee you must pay.

Forms, Forms, Forms



You do not need to complete Form 3: Verification of Other Professional Licensure/Certification – UNLESS:

You currently hold or have held a license or certificate to practice any profession*, anywhere.

If this applies to you then complete Form 3 and send the entire form to the appropriate licensing/certifying authority for completion of Section II – and check with them to determine if there is a fee you must pay.

Do NOT mail this to the NYS Office of the Professions!

*See page 2 of the Address/Name Change Form for a list of applicable professions.

Timing is Everything



- Most new Au.D. graduates want to begin working as soon as their externship is complete; however, New York State licensure can NOT be granted until your degree has been conferred and Form 2 has been submitted and reviewed.
- If you have been offered a job it would be wise to inform your prospective employer that you can not begin working as an independent audiologist until you have obtained NYS Licensure.
