SUBJECT: Changes to the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education Relating to Professional Education in the Applied Behavior Analysis Professions

At its September 2023 meeting, the Board of Regents took [emergency action](#) to amend education and other requirements for Licensed Behavior Analysts (LBAs) and Certified Behavior Analyst Assistants (CBAAAs). **This memorandum provides information on the actions that existing licensure qualifying LBA and CBAA programs should take for continuous program registration.** Please share the following information with the appropriate administrators and faculty at your institution.

It can take the form of basic or applied research or it can involve interventions that change behavior. The experiential learning requirement can be met through the student's professional employment if an appropriate level of supervision or oversight is provided by the program faculty and the experiential learning is a requirement for obtaining the degree - that is, if the experiential learning occurs before the degree is awarded.
