Commissioner's Regulation Section 59.19(c)

A certificate pursuant to Business Corporation Law, section 1503 (b) (ii) may be issued when:

- 1. the proposed name of the corporation appropriately describes the profession practiced and the services to be provided; and
- 2. if the proposed name of the corporation includes a reference to a specialized area of professional practice, satisfactory evidence is submitted of compliance with any provision of Part 29 of this Title, rules of the Board of Regents restricting or regulating the use of specialty titles or announcements of limitations of practice in the particular profession.

Article 135, Veterinary Medicine and Animal Health Technology

§6701. Definition of practice of veterinary medicine.

The practice of the profession of veterinary medicine is defined as diagnosing, treating, operating, or prescribing for any animal disease, pain, injury, deformity or dental or physical condition, or the subcutaneous insertion of a microchip intended to be used to identify an animal. "Animal" includes every living creature except a human being. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, no provisions of this section shall be construed to include the floating of equine teeth as being within the practice of veterinary medicine.
