Welcome and Review of Agenda:

Dr. Morgante welcomed everyone and made a motion to call the meeting to order at 10: 00 a.m. Formal introductions followed.

MINUTES:

The minutes of the November 7, 2024 meeting were reviewed. A motion was made to approve the minutes as amended (Steinberg/Jarrett-Thelwell).

BOARD CHAIR REPORT:

Dr. Morgante began his report by calling for a motion to move agenda items (Zumpano/Jarrett-Thelwell). Dr. Morgante informed members that as state board members we advise and assist the Education Department, and the mission of the Board is to protect the public.

Dr. Morgante ended his report stating that we look forward to continuing to work with the Northeast College of Health Sciences, D'Youville University, NYCC and NYSCA.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT:

Dr. Cottrell started her report by introducing the Board staff. Dr. Cottrell informed members that NYS is in their legislative session.

Dr. Cottrell asked the board members if anyone is planning to go to the FCLB Annual Meeting in St. Louis Missouri on April 30- May 3, 2025. Dr. Cottrell will be the delegate for the FCLB meeting and Dr. Handt will be the alternate. Dr. Handt agreed to be a delegate and Dr. Steinberg agreed to be the alternate delegate for the NBCE portion of the meeting.

Dr. Cottrell presented a certificate to Dr. Jarrett-Thelwell for her exemplary service as Board Chair.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Legislative Committee – Dr. Morgante, Chair, stated the Scope Modernization Bill has an Assembly and Senate sponsor. Ms. Kellogg stated that NYSCA is waiting for the Senate bill number and that Assembly women Sarah Clarke from Rochester is the assembly sponsor for the Scope Modernization Bill. Ms. Kellogg stated there is momentum with the Scope Modernization Bill. Dr. Ludwig stated that NYCC is working on the Medicaid pilot program, an Anti-discrimination bill and a separate Preceptorship bill to allow out of state chiropractic students to practice under the supervision of a NYS licensed chiropractor. The Board had a lengthy discussion about the need for a Preceptorship Bill and the impact it may have on the momentum of the Scope Modernization Bill.

Practice Committee – Dr. Handt Chair, Dr. Handt spoke in favor of the Preceptorship Bill because it will allow out of state chiropractic students to get experience in NYS. This could also widen the pool of candidates for retiring chiropractors looking for a DC to take over their practice.

Public Information Committee - Dr. Steinberg, Chair, stated that the Corrected Weight Loss Management Practice Alert is still with Legal.

Outreach Committee – Dr. Taber, Chair, stated that he is working with the prior chair to see what has been done in the past. Dr. DiBenedetto, a former chair of the committee stated that Dr. Taber should reach out to NYSCA, NYCC, Northeast and D'Youville to see what they are doing to promote the chiropractic profession.

Program Review Committee (extension of the practice committee) – Dr. Jarrett-Thelwell, Chair, stated that the same subject matters are being denied for CE courses, for example injecting stem cells and animal chiropractic.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Scope Modernization update – In the legislative committee report.

- Part IV Boards update- Dr. Cottrell stated that Dr. Morgante and Dr. Taber will be the Board Examiners for the May 2025 Part IV exam at Northeast. Dr. DiBenedetto informed members that the May 2026 Part IV exams will be offered at the chiropractic schools and in Greeley, Colorado. After May 2026 the Part IV exams will only be held in Greeley, Colorado. The Board had a lengthy discussion about the substantial costs for students to travel to Colorado to take the Part IV exam.
