Dental Hygienist

Dental Hygienists practice in varied settings, under supervision and in collaboration with a dentist, providing preventative and therapeutic care to manage the risk of tooth decay and periodontal diseases for all populations. They **assess** patients' oral health needs, **plan** and **implement** treatment strategies, **evaluate** treatment outcomes, and **document** all services to the Dental Records.

Examples of Services:

- take and analyze comprehensive health history and vitals,
- perform dental and periodontal risk assessments,
- expose diagnostic dental x-rays,
- provide counseling to improve oral health,
- remove tartar & plaque from the teeth, and
- apply cavity preventing agents.

Professional Education

Complete a Commission of Dental Accreditation (CODA) accredited licensure qualifying program

Written: National Board Dental Hygiene Examination, and *Clinical*: The Commission on Dental Competency Assessments clinical dental hygiene examination
